SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

FRIDAY MAY 25

All Day

A1 6:00 am **BIRDING SHORE TO SHORE** – Michael Carlson

Travel with Michael from Lake Huron to Georgian Bay. We will visit some of his favorite spots including Stokes Bay, Hopeness and Malcolm Bluff. (*easy, car-pool, bring lunch*) (limit 20)

A2 6:15 am **BRUCE BACKCOUNTRY BIRDING** – Mark Wiercinski

Visit the upper Peninsula’s best-known birding spots such as Dyer’s Bay, Cabot Head, the sparrow fields and Crane Lake. You will benefit from Mark’s superb birding skills and enjoy the outstanding scenery. (*easy, car-pool, bring lunch*) (limit 20)

A3 6:30 am **BIRDING INLAND LAKES** – Judith King ☆ **symbol**

Judith, a popular leader from the past, is back! She will take us birding along the chain of inland lakes and the adjacent fields and forests. The lakes offer classic marshes so marsh birds will be featured. (*easy, car-pool, bring lunch*) (limit 20)

A4 7:00 am **MALCOLM BLUFF & CAPE CROKER** – Alfred Raab

Bird in the rich habitats within Malcolm Bluff Shores Nature Reserve and Neyaashiinigiing territory on the Cape Croker peninsula. These areas have yielded some special finds in past years and the bluffs provide spectacular vistas. (*moderate, car-pool, bring lunch*) (limit 20)

A5 8:00 am **BOTANY OF THE BRUCE** – Walter Muma

Walter will explore several sites on the Bruce Peninsula for orchids, spring wildflowers and other wild botany. Stops will include a rich hardwood forest, alvars and Dorcas Bay for its famous orchids. (*easy, car-pool, bring lunch*) (limit 15)

A6 6:45 am **KINCARDINE LAGOONS aka “PELEE NORTH”** – James Turland

Hike the trails of this premier birding hotspot. If you missed seeing birds at Point Pelee, chances are you’ll find them here. (*easy, car-pool*) (limit 20)

A7 7:30 am **BIRDING THE PARK PERIMETER** – Marshall Byle

Join our local lifelong birder, Marshall as he leads us through habitats around the Park. The perimeter is a mecca for an eclectic mix of birds. (*easy, car-pool*) (limit 20)

Learn what nocturnal adaptations it takes to rule the night on this interactive hike! From owls to crickets to fireflies, learn how these creatures are able to thrive when the lights go out. (*easy, outdoors*) (limit 20)

FIELD TRIP INFORMATION

Sturdy footwear is recommended for all outings. Black-legged Ticks, carrying Lyme Disease, have been found in Bruce County. Be tick savvy.

Difficulty Levels

Mobility Limited symbol Groomed and maintained trails. Walking with difficulty for any distance.

Easy – Walking leisurely on groomed and maintained trails. Participants should be able to walk up to 1.5 kilometres (1 mile) without any problems.

Moderate – Walking on maintained trails some of which may be rough or rocky. Brisk walking may be required to get from one location to another in a timely manner. Participants should be able to walk up to 4.5 kilometres (3 miles) without any problems.

Difficult – Walking on trails that have uneven terrain. There may be some walking off trail. Participants should be able to negotiate walking on slippery surfaces, where there is unsure footing or where they are climbing over rocks and logs.

Car-pooling

To reduce our carbon footprint, we encourage car-pooling. If you are a passenger, please consider giving a donation to the driver on away-from-the-Park trips.

Walkie-talkies

Bring your own if you have them. Walkie-talkie communication between vehicles keeps you aware of stops, directions, traffic safety and birds along the way.
